


Small Actions, Big Changes **IN PATIENT SAFETY**

At the European Patient Safety Conference in Madrid, we celebrated projects that demonstrate how small actions can drive big changes. This award, inspired by the 'butterfly effect,' honours innovative and accessible practices that have a measurable, positive impact on patient safety.

THE WINNER OF THE 2024 BUTTERFLY IMPACT AWARD IN PATIENT SAFETY IS:

The ERNST Consortium (COST Action 19113): The European Researchers' Network Working on Second Victims. Presented by Prof. José Joaquín Mira of Miguel Hernández University of Elche, Spain, and Prof. Dr. Reinhard Strametz of Wiesbaden Institute for Healthcare Economics and Patient Safety (WiHelp), Germany, this project supports healthcare professionals experiencing emotional distress following patient safety incidents, commonly known as "second-victim syndrome." Through a collaborative network, the ERNST Consortium provides essential resources to reduce long-term psychological impacts on these professionals, ultimately enhancing patient safety and outcomes.

We also congratulate our distinguished finalists:

2nd Prize: Eliminating Thirst and Dehydration Before Surgery – Led by Dr. Anne Rüggeberg and Dr. Eike Nickel, MaHM, redefining pre-operative fasting protocols for better patient comfort and outcomes.

3rd Prize: Effective Communication and Patient Safety Among Nurses – Presented by Mrs. Doina Carmen Mazilu and Mrs. Viorica Nedelcu, enhancing teamwork and communication among perioperative nurses.

Patient and Professional Safety – From Concept to Action
Conference organised by OAMGMAMR (The Order of Nurses, Midwives, and Medical Assistants in Romania), 17 September 2024, Bucharest Romania

Key information:

- Each year, EUPSF celebrates the World Patient Safety Day with one of its Affiliates
- WPSD 2024 focused on improving diagnosis for patient safety, using the slogan "Get it right, make it safe!"
- OAMGMAMR represents more than 160,000 healthcare professionals in Romania
- The conference was attended by 150 participants

Nurses, midwives, and medical assistants play a vital role in the diagnostic process. Through their close interaction with patients, specialised expertise, and collaboration with other healthcare professionals, they help ensure that patient conditions are assessed accurately and promptly. Their contributions are essential to delivering safe, effective care and improving outcomes for patients.

However, chronic fatigue is increasingly affecting healthcare professionals in Romania and across Europe due to workforce shortages and challenging working conditions. Fatigue leads to impaired reflexes, decreased alertness, risk misjudgment, and poor decision-making – factors that can negatively impact diagnosis and patient care.



That is why the EUPSF and the OAMGMAMR jointly launched the "Fighting Fatigue Together" campaign in Romania at the occasion of the World Patient Safety Day.



EUROPEAN HEALTH FORUM GASTEIN



For the second year, we participated in the European Health Forum Gastein, one of the most influential advocacy events in Europe. After receiving the prestigious European Health Leadership Award in 2023 for our Fighting Fatigue Together campaign, we returned to Gastein this year to highlight the critical connections between digital innovation, patient safety, and staff well-being.

Our session, "**Enhancing care delivery through digital innovation: Patient safety and staff well-being as guiding principles**" was organised together with **Philips** and moderated by the journalist Artur Olesch, specialised in digital health. Together with Dr. Miglė Trumpickaitė (European Junior Doctors Association), Dr. Marc Lazarovici (Global Network for Simulation in Healthcare), Dr. Mark Konrad (Philips) our General Secretary Mrs. Mirka Cikkelova discussed how digital innovation can enhance patient safety and why its adoption has been frustratingly slow so far.

KEY DISCUSSION POINTS :

Patient safety and the well-being of healthcare professionals must be our guiding principles when selecting and implementing new technologies

- Outdated IT systems, limited training, and chronic fatigue among healthcare professionals are huge barriers for technology uptake.**
- To unlock the potential of digital innovation and improve patient outcomes, we must focus on patient safety; recognise that each healthcare setting is unique, and solutions must be tailored to their specific needs; provide healthcare professionals with the time, training and support they need to integrate new technologies without compromising their capacity to deliver quality care.**
- Collaboration between healthcare professionals, technology providers, patients, and managers is crucial. Only by working together can we overcome these barriers and ensure that technology serves its purpose: safer, better care for all.**



Open letter calling for a European Patient Safety Strategy

Together with 12 other partner organisations from the European Alliance for the Organisation of a European Multistakeholder Partnership (EMAP), we are calling for a European Patient Safety Strategy to be urgently developed and adopted. The open letter was sent by the European Health Ministers to the European Commission, the European Parliament, the ENCAT Alliance, to all the members of the European Parliament, to the representatives of the European Council and to the European Health Commissioner, Mrs. Stella Kyriakides.

This call covers all types of adverse events, the most common cause being medication errors, and also refers to the impact of healthcare professional fatigue on patient safety. It urges the European institutions to take steps to develop such a strategy, building on the [WHO Global Patient Safety Strategy: Patient Safety Action Plan 2024-2026](#) and on existing European texts on patient safety.




Our vision
